

1. How satisfied are you with your membership in SIR?




2. How long have you been a member?




3. Would you recommend our branch to others?




4. How likely are you to renew your membership?




5. How often do you participate in branch activities (including luncheons)?




6. How often do you read the monthly newsletter?



7. How well does our branch do in including new members in activities? 51 responses






9. What types of speakers would you like to hear from in the coming year? 51 responses



10. What do you think is the best membership benefit we offer? 51 responses




11. What would make your membership more valuable to you?



12. Are you satisfied with the frequency of communication from the branch? 51 responses




13. How often do you visit the branch website?
